









About Austin Sunshine Camps

Founded in 1928, <u>Austin Sunshine Camps</u> (ASC) provides FREE overnight camp for youth who qualify for free/reduced lunch or are in foster care. We believe in the power of summer camp, and we believe that your ability to go to camp shouldn't be determined by how much money your family makes.

Camp is held for four sessions of ten days and nine nights each. All eight year old campers will spend seven days and six nights at camp. Staff in eight-year-old cabins will still work the full ten-day camp session. Summer staff members live on site for the duration of each camp session. On the afternoon of day ten, after campers have departed, staff members participate in training and camp cleanup, and then have four days off before the next session starts.

ASC has two beautiful, unique camp locations:

- Located in the beautiful Turkey Bend Recreation Area in Marble Falls, <u>Lake Travis</u> (LT) offers a rustic setting for up to 55 campers each session, ages 12-15. Campers have the opportunity to swim in the lake, explore the hill country, play a variety of sports and games, experience our high ropes course and more.

- Zilker Lodge provides an amazing urban oasis for up to 80 campers each session, ages 8-11. Campers have
 the opportunity to explore Zilker Park, canoe on Lady Bird Lake, hike on the Greenbelt, make a variety of crafts,

Kitchen Assistant

About the Role

At Austin Sunshine Camps our main focus is to provide our campers with an environment where they are able to safely grow, connect, and explore. We are looking for candidates how have experience in preparing large amounts of food, management of a budget and inventory, working with children from diverse backgrounds. We want candidates that know the best nutritional practices for youth have high energy, a positive attitude, and grit!

The primary role of the Kitchen Assistant will be to work with the Kitchen Manager to ensure an environment that accounts for the unique dietary and nutritional needs of each camper, staff member, and volunteer. Kitchen Assistants prepare and serve delicious and nutritious meals, three times a day, as well as snacks 2-3 times per day for 130 campers and staff. The Kitchen Assistant performs all washing and cleaning duties required in the kitchen. Kitchen Assistants work approximately nine hours per day.

The Kitchen Assistant helps the Kitchen Manager ensure that safety regulations are followed, helps with the preparation of food, helps monitor health standards of the kitchen, assists in the organization of all food items, in accordance with health code standards, and helps take inventory for food orders.

The Kitchen Assistant will work alongside the Kitchen Manager and Camp Directors to develop meal plans and accommodations for campers or staff with any specific dietary needs, in order to give them the ability to safely stay at and participate in camp, and will communicate those plans to parents, to counselors and to all relevant staff.

The Kitchen Assistant's job involves, but is not limited to:

- Food Management, Preparation and Service
 - Under the supervision of the Kitchen Manager, collect, store, and inventory food products and supplies in accordance with with Health Code and American Camp Association standards
 - Prepare and serve food daily in accordance with health standards
 - Take initiative to stay up to date on best practices when it pertains to health in the camp industry
- Meal Accommodations
 - With the Kitchen Manager, account for any allergies or dietary restrictions while preparing meals and snacks

- Brief staff on dietary/nutritional plans made with certain campers around needed accommodations, modifications or other tools that will help them be successful during camp
- Cleaning and Sanitation
 - Removing the garbage, washing garbage cans, cleaning refrigerators, freezers, and storage rooms
 - o Washing dishes after each meal with assistance from our Counselors in Training
- Camper and Staff interaction
 - o Balance the responsibilities of authority, safety and fun when interacting with staff and with campers
- Administrative duties
 - o Ensure adherence to ASC's Policies, health department, and American Camp Association standards
 - Keep regular inventory of food and supplies and assist the Kitchen Manager in managing the bi-weekly food ordering spreadsheets
- Other duties as assigned
